In 2007, Ken Rosato was named co-anchor for Eyewitness News in the morning and noon.

Ken joined WABC-TV in December of 2003 as a freelance reporter after spending a year across town at FOX-5 where he was the morning and midday anchor and a reporter.

He also spent five years as an anchor and reporter at WFOR-TV, the CBS-owned station in Miami/Fort Lauderdale where he covered a number of major hurricanes. While there, he covered the 2000 Presidential stalemate and the year-long Elian Gonzales affair, and was nominated for a 2000 Suncoast Emmy Award.

Ken also worked for WETM-TV, the NBC affiliate in Elmira/Binghamton, NY as an anchor where he was honored with a New York State Associated Press award. He was news director and main anchor at WLNY-TV on Long Island, and regularly appeared as a commentator on WLIW-TV's "21 Edition".

He's a member of the National Association of Hispanic Journalists and can be seen weekdays anchoring for Eyewitness News this Morning and Eyewitness News at Noon.
